Proposal about Gun Safety:

Hoosiers Concerned about Gun Violence (HCGV), a nonprofit organization concerned about gun safety, is concerned about the number of guns sold in Indiana without background checks on the purchasers (especially at gun shows held frequently in Indiana). (Brad Yoder is a member of the Board of Directors of HCGV).

HCGV is planning to work with Indiana legislators in 2019 to introduce a bill which would require universal background checks for all gun purchases in Indiana. They are soliciting support from churches and other organizations in this effort.

Our Outreach Commission sees this as an important peace and justice issue, and we recommend that Shalom Mennonite sign on with HCGV as a supporter of this effort toward reducing gun violence and increasing gun safety in Indiana.

Milepost #618 Preparing for Anything

As I explained in my sermon last week, I believe that John the Baptist had one of the hardest "jobs" out of all of the characters in the Bible, because he was supposed to "prepare the way for the Lord," even though he didn't know exactly what "the Lord" was going to do when he arrived. That must be tricky — preparing for something when you don't know what to expect! Can you imagine preparing for a wedding when you don't know anything about the bride, the groom, the expectations, or the guests? Or preparing for a competition when you have no idea what you are going to be up against? How is this even possible?

John' strategy seemed to rely heavily on the spiritual disciplines. He invited people to join him in the *solitude* of the desert, so they could *confess* their sins, and *pray to God* for forgiveness and healing. These are just three of the spiritual disciplines that we studied this year, but it is worth taking a moment to

consider their important role in this story. Because the people received John's message well and "all the people of Jerusalem were going out to see him," (Mark 1:5) God kept Her promise from way back in 2 Chronicles "if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, pray, seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land" (emphasis added). Apparently in response to the community's display of piety and humility, God did hear this request from heaven and in fact spoke from heaven, saying to Jesus (in the presence of all John's disciples), "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." With these words, God the Mother commissioned Jesus to begin his public ministry of healing and forgiveness.

None of us know exactly what God is going to do next, so there is no way to completely prepare for it. However, by practicing the spiritual disciplines, we make our selves *internally* prepared for anything that God sends our way. So let us make an effort to prioritize and practice the 12 disciplines that we have studied this year – even if we don't see a lot of practical benefit in them in the short term, for this is how we make ourselves ready for whatever God is doing *next*.
