<u>Solar Panel Project – Congregational Vote Due</u> Aug 11

The Vision and Accountability Team (VAT) began taking votes on the Solar Panel Proposal from the Outreach Commission Sunday, August 4th. The vote concerns the following statement: "I am in favor of going ahead with the Solar Panel Proposal as presented on Sunday, July 21 with a contract involving Jefferson Electric, Inc. for \$79,942.50 - This amount will be paid by transferring \$40,000 from Shalom's Checking account (operating budget surplus) with the remaining balance to be paid by individual contributions."
