## Last Sunday, April 7

Our Conference Pastor, Dan Miller, came down to speak to us about answering for hope. He noted that the familiar "cold-call" style of confronting people about faith feels inconsistent for many of us with the way we want to live and respect people, and asked, how do we express our hope in authentic ways? Romans 12:1-2, 11-12; 1 Peter 3:15b

## This Sunday, April 14

is Palm Sunday, the climactic moment in the gospel of Luke when Jesus finally brings the Jubilee movement to Jerusalem. In the first part of this sermon, focusing on Luke 19:37-48, we see Jesus liberate Jerusalem from the structural and spiritual forces that were keeping it in bondage. However, after a short period of celebration, we see the forces of evil take one last stab at Jesus and his movement, especially in Luke 22:1-6, 14-34. Join us as we joyfully celebrate Jesus' victory and then somberly prepare for his betrayal this Sunday.

## Next Sunday, April 21

is Easter, the day when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. Throughout our study of Luke, Jesus has been going from town to town and village to village proclaiming peace, and now, we will see how the resurrection of Christ "finishes the work" of Jubilee by establishing Jesus as both Lord and Christ. Luke 24:1-12 & 36-49 will be the central texts.

## Structure Evaluation

Shalom's organization/structure has been serving us for about a year and a half and it's time for a performance review. The VAT (Vision & Accountability Team, our governing body) has asked Sam Bixler and Cheryl Martin to conduct this evaluation. They will meet with the VAT, the Spiritual Gifts Discernment Team, the Pastoral Team, and each of the commissions to learn how the structure is working in those settings. Then the congregation will be surveyed to provide indivudal input – how well is our structure working for you? When all the information has been gathered, it will be shared in aggregate with the VAT and with the congregation in a group meeting. Proposales for tweaks or major changes may be proposed, depending on results of the feedback from the evaluation. No time has been set for the congregational meeting, but it should take place soon after the survey is completed.

#### **MILEPOST #675**

The Week of the Young Child With the recent birth of Elise Marie and Kara Jeanne I have been reflecting on all of the children recently coming to populate the classrooms of our church. Jesus said.

"Let the little children come unto me for such is the reign of God" Matthew 19:14

This week, as a nation, we celebrate the **Week of the Young Child™** which focuses public attention on the needs of young children and their families and to recognize the early childhood programs and services that meet those needs.

Recent advances in neuroscience drive home what we already knew--that the first five years of a child's life are the most important in terms of physical, social, cognitive, and emotional development. And what the young child hears and expresses (verbally and nonverbally) are, equally, of critical importance. The old adage "a child is to be seen and not heard," no longer applies. I remember my Mom telling me that as a little girl she was scared of her Grandpa. She remembers him being rather gruff, and sitting in a rocker with a big white tobacco stained beard. I hope that's not my legacy!

And of course, what Jesus said above about children, only follows what he learned from deep roots in his Jewish heritage: <sup>4</sup> Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. <sup>a</sup> <sup>5</sup> Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your strength. <sup>6</sup> These commandments that **I** 

give you today are to be on your hearts. <sup>7</sup> Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up (Deuteronomy 6).

I have heard some of you say, "It takes a village to raise a child."
