He earned a Bachelor of Arts from Meserete Kristos College in Bishoftu, Ethiopia, in 2016 and is currently serving as Ethiopia Assistant for AMBS's MA: Theology and Global Anabaptism program. He is interested in exploring a ministry of administration and leadership. We look forward to having him, his wife, Misgana Eshete (who is also an MA: Theology and Peace Studies student at AMBS), and their daughter join us on Sunday, and to hearing what God has to say to us through Henok.

This Sunday, January 26

Brian will begin a four-part series on Slavery and Freedom in the Bible, with Exodus 1:1-14 and Galatians 4:1-7 as the introductory texts.

Next Sunday, February 2

We will continue with the theme of slavery and freedom by wrestling with the way that the Bible treats the institution of ancient slavery. Paul especially calls for our spiritual liberation, but what implications does this have for people who have been literally enslaved? 1 Corinthians 7:17-24 and Acts 16:16-24 will serve as key points in this discussion.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

This week we have honored one of the United States' greatest advocates for social justice, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. King is well known for his leadership in the Civil Rights Movement in the 1950's and until his assassination on April 4, 1968. Dr. King would have been 91 years old this month.

Dr. King's commitment to racial justice led him to take direct action through nonviolent means to eliminate unjust laws and to push toward racial equality. Through sit-ins, boycotts, marches, and other public protests, Dr. King demonstrated Why We Can't Wait (the title of one of his many books). In his famous Letter from Birmingham Jail, King said "I have almost reached the regrettable conclusion that the [Negro's] greatest stumbling block in his stride toward freedom is . . . the white moderate who is more devoted to "order" than to justice."

Less known sometimes are Dr. King's strong opposition to the US war in Vietnam, and his 1968 Poor People's Campaign to improve the life of the most needy in the US. (I participated in that movement here in Indianapolis.) May we all continuously renew our commitment to work of various kinds toward the achievement of Dr. King's "beloved community".
