REFLECTIONS ON THE JOURNEY

Praying for the President

Today marked the beginning of a new presidential administration, as Joe Biden and Kamala Harris were sworn in as the President and Vice-President of the United States. For some, this is a welcome change, as the Biden administration plans to do things in a drastically different way than the Trump administration did. For others, it is a moment of dread, as they find themselves in a position with much less political representation and power. Either way, Christians must be especially careful not to get so caught up in the moment that we forget that our allegiance is not to any person, party, or even nation, but to Jesus Christ. So how can we appropriately respond to an event this significant without dipping into idolatry? The Bible invites us to pray for government officials (cf. 1 Timothy 2:1-2), not only for their sake, but also for our own.

For those of us who are happy about having a new president and vice-president, praying for them reminds us that they are still human, and even if we like them, we can't assume that they will always make the right decisions. So we pray that God will help them, because they really do need divine assistance for such weighty responsibilities, and we pray in order to open ourselves up as vessels of God, whether that means offering encouragment or critique or even rebuke when necessary.

For those of us who are unhappy about the change in administration, praying for political leaders reminds us that they are still human. Although it's often appropriate to be disappointed in or angry with political figures, prayer changes the nature of that anger. Rather than seeing them as enemies, accepting the caricatures of them as realistic, or allowing them to become some symbol of evil or oppression, prayer teaches us to think of them as human beings - children of God - who deserve love and honor, regardless of what they have done, and who could still be led in the right direction by God's grace.

And for all of us, praying for leaders reminds us that God is ultimately "above" even our highest political officials. There is no doubt that presidents and vice-presidents can have a monumental impact on society, but nothing can happen apart from God's will, and there is a hope and security in that. So wherever you fall on that spectrum, I encourage to take this Biblical instruction seriously and spend some time both today and in the years to come praying for President Biden and Vice President Harris.
