Proclaiming Jubilee: Epilogue

Last Sunday, we read the final chapter of Luke together, in which Christ came back from the dead and re-established his peace among the disciples. Having clothed his disciples with the power of his indestructible love, his final proclamation of peace in Luke 24 brings our series on "Proclaiming Jubilee," to an end. What a high note to end on!

But is it the end? Although we finished Luke's gospel on Sunday, Luke went on to write a second book that is also in our Bibles, the Acts of the Apostles. And in this book, he writes a kind of "epilogue" to is gospel by looking back on the forty day period between Jesus' resurrection and his ascension. At the end of that time frame, Luke reports that the disciples asked him this question: "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?"

That was kind of the whole point of Jubilee, wasn't it? To restore Israel so that it could be come a socially and spiritually flourishing

society, to throw off the reign of Satan and restore the kingdom of God, to rekindle the light of Israel so that it could be a light to the nations, fulfilling the vision we see in Isaiah and many of the other prophets. So what happened to that dream? Did it just... die?

In his response, Jesus doesn't say, "You're misinterpreting the Scriptures again. That's not going to happen." Instead he tells them that they don't know the times or dates when this final step of Jubilee will occur, but in the mean time, he is sending them out to preach the good news again – just as he did before – except this time, it is not just to Galilee, or even just to the land of Israel, but to 'the ends of the earth."

And so, everything that the disciples do in the book of Acts is actually a part of the "Epilogue" to Luke. In fact, we are still living in that Epilogue today. Whenever we try to carry on Jesus' ministry of healing, of confronting and casting out our social demons, of proclaiming God's will for humanity, and inviting people to put their trust in Jesus the Messiah, we part of the third wave of Jesus' disciples, who go from town to town and village to village proclaiming and establishing the good news, with the authority of Jesus and the power of his love as our protection and our guide.
