<u>Last Sunday (11/22)</u>, Wilma Baily delivered a sermon on "Thinking about gratitude when the world is troubled".

This Sunday (11/29) is the first Sunday of Advent, and we will spend this time reflecting on the longing for the Messiah that developed among the Jews during the exile. This week, we'll engage the books of Joel and Isaiah as they depict the Messiah as the one who brings vindication through judgment.

<u>Next Sunday (12/6)</u> is the second Sunday of Advent, and we will celebrate by joining another congregation - East Goshen Mennonite Church - in the first of two joint worship sessions. Brian will be preaching about the hopes that emerged not only for a Jewish Messiah, but for a Messiah who could save the whole world.



Due to the Covid19 virus, we have had to give up several of our traditions this year. With the Christmas season coming up, Worship Commission is polling the congregation to see how many people would be interested in participating in a round-the-circle time (outside) of caroling later in December. If we stay distanced

Grieving through Gratitude

Tomorrow is Thanksgiving, but for many of us, it will not be an especially joyful occasion. For the past several years, some of us have made it an annual tradition to gather and celebrate Thanksgiving together at the church, but this year's gathering had to be canceled due to the rise in COVID-19 cases. Others of us usually spend this time visiting with extended family, but many of these gatherings have also been canceled or seriously changed in order to curb the spread of the virus. We may be grieving these losses, while we read depressing news reports about the world suffering from economic devastation, hurricane damage, and civil wars. Of course, for our church family, the biggest loss we are feeling is the tragic death of Tim Bixler last week.

I've never really liked the idea that we ought to "praise God in the midst of suffering," when taken to mean that God expects us to put on a happy face even when we are going through tragic losses. But there is still a place for gratitude in the face of loss: as a tool to help us grieve. After all, to grieve is to express the pain we feel over the loss of something *good*. In order to fully grieve, it can help to articulate how good and meaningful and important that loss was, which naturally produces a kind of gratitude. So I would encourage us all, during this Thanksgiving, not to suppress any sadness that comes up in the hopes of salvaging the holiday, but to step into that sadness - at least for a few minutes - by acknowledging how valuable that which we have lost was to us. We can do this whether the loss is as silly as a missed Thanksgiving tradition or as serious as a family member. And perhaps in that process of honest grieving, we will find ourselves, strangely enough, in a place of sincere gratitude.
