Advent 2018: Waiting for Guidance

This Sunday will be the first day of Advent, which is a period of waiting, watching, and anticipating that God will act to save us. During the last part of the Older Testament, the Jews were waiting for God to send a Messiah to redeem and restore their nation. Christians believe that Jesus was that Messiah, and yet we too find ourselves waiting for the Messiah to intervene in our world and to set things right.

During Advent, we turn our attention to God and re-commit to this practice of waiting for the Messiah. However, the kind of waiting we do is not a period of passive waiting, as though we are hoping that the Messiah will come and fix all of our problems while we sit back and relax. Instead, it is a period of active waiting, for the Scriptures both Old and New proclaim that the Messiah will lead us to salvation: the Messiah will take the first steps. and then we will be able to follow. For example, consider this famous Messianic prophecy from Micah 5:2-3.

"But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. Therefore, he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth: then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel."

Notice, in this passage, the prophet is waiting for the Messiah to "come forth" to rule in Israel, but after the Messiah acts, this is immediately followed by an action of God's people ("to return"). This means that God has an active role for us to play in the story of redemption. God wants us to be the hands

and feet of Jesus. We are the ones who are to heal the sick, care for the poor, advocate for the oppressed, and preach the good news to those who do not know it. But, we should not just go out and try to save the world as though we are the Messiah. We wait for Jesus to act first, to "come forth." Then, we follow after him.

With this in mind, the Discipling Commission felt that it was fitting to combine Advent with our final spiritual discipline for the year: guidance. Christians should regularly seek God's will for our lives, and the practices of individual and corporate guidance can help us do this. During Advent especially, we acknowledge that the world is in need of salvation and we don't know how to fix it, but we tune our eyes toward Bethlehem, preparing to respond when our Savior shows us the way.
