December a year ago, the extensive solar array on Shalom's south roof went on the electrical grid and since inception, the panels have produced 53.14 megawatts of power. This translates into **2,277.58 lbs** of C02 emissions saved, or the equivalent of **621.68** trees planted! First Mennonite Church on Indy's west side, recently brought on grid their own 100 panel solar array. They wrote, "Shalom served as an inspiration and example for FMC when we undertook our plans for solar. Our panels are now installed and generating and this is cause for celebration!" FMC held a celebration and dedication on May 22 and entitled it "Let Your Light Shine".

The mission of **Interfaith Power and Light**, an organization with which we are affiliated, is to mobilize a religious response to global warming. Their mission is "to inspire and mobilize people of faith and conscience to take bold and just action on climate change." We are in the process of applying to this organization for their "Certified Cool Congregation" status which is intended to help congregations continue taking steps to enhance the environment. ~ Frank Kandel for the Outreach Commission

Pastor Brian is now fully vaccinated, and so he plans to begin holding "Roving Office" meetings at various parts in the city on most Mondays. Anyone is welcome to come and visit during those hours, but it is strongly recommended that only people who are fully vaccinated participate and that considerations regarding health and safety are given the first priority.

The **Gathering Safely Committee** reviewed the survey results. 65% of those who responded said yes, and there were a number of helpful comments. We reviewed current cases in Central Indiana and current CDC guidance, and decided that we could start hybrid worship services on June 13 (to give commissions time to prepare). Here's how it will look:

- About 20 persons or households will be able to participate each Sunday. Every other pew has been roped
  off to keep a 6-foot distance, and one person or household will be able to sit at each end of each open pew.
  Tech personnel, preacher, and worship leader may sit in the front pews. There are chairs in the back that
  could be used for unexpected guests or ushers.
- Martha will work with Tim on a signup process, as not all those who said "yes" can be accommodated all at once. Details to come later.
- We will mask and distance while indoors. Preacher and worship leader may remove masks while in the pulpit if they have been fully vaccinated (last dose of the series at least 2 weeks earlier) so that their faces can be seen and their speech understood on Zoom.
- Initially, at least, there will not be Sunday school. Laura Harms, who is our children's ed coordinator, is working on an outdoor activity for kids 2 years old and up during part of the worship service.
- Since we have unvaccinated persons among us, and since singing transmits more virus than speaking, we will not sing while indoors. We may hum (while masked), clap, stand and move, or play a rhythm instrument during the recorded music. If Worship Commission chooses, a final song could be sung outside, with unvaccinated persons keeping masks on.

- After worship, we will exit promptly, and do our chatting outside.
- Anyone who feels ill should stay home, even if they have signed up to attend.
- Safely Gathering Committee will continue to review the cases in the community and make adjustments as needed.

## REFLECTIONS ON THE JOURNEY

Our Chapter in the Bible's Story

This Sunday, I will preach the last sermon in the Story of the Bible series. In a little over a year, we will have read and discussed the entire scope of the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation. However, that does not mean that we have "read" or covered all of God's Story, which reaches outside of the pages of the Bible and includes us as well.

I have said on a few occasions that we are in Act VI of the Bible's Story. That is the Act entitled "The Church," in which God's people do the ground-laying work of reconciling the world to God in anticipate of the final reconciliation between God and the World in Act VII. Although the Bible is "closed" in one sense, in that believers are forbidden from adding or detracting Scriptures from the Biblical canon (cf. Revelation 22:18-19), the Bible intentionally looks to the future, to our times, and gives blessings and speaks about the work God will do through us, even though we are doing God's work thousands of years after they were. This is clear in passages like Psalm 102:18, which says, "Let this be recorded for a generation to come, so that a people yet unborn may praise the Lord" and in Jesus' prayer in John 17:20-21, which says, "I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me."

The Bible's Story is not designed for our entertainment, but for our participation. The mantle of God's people has passed from generation to generation, starting with Abraham and Sarah and coming all the way down to us, and it is in light of the work that our forebearers have done that

we can know how to move forward in faith. Although this series has been somewhat tedious and academic at times, my prayer is that it will help ground us all in the faith and help us as individuals and as a church to understand our own role in God's work of salvation.  $\sim$  Brian
