Last Sunday, April 1:

Easter fell on April Fools' Day, which brought into focus the dilemma believers face between believing in a miracle that defies human experience and guarding ourselves against being "fooled." How do we address this dilemma? It can help to ask questions and do some research, but no amount of research can remove the risk of faith, the possibility that we could be wrong. Research and reason are healthy and appropriate, but sooner or later, a time will come when we must decide which is the greater risk: to have faith and be wrong, or to not have faith and to miss out on the possibility of new life.

This Sunday, April 8:

We will continue to celebrate Easter by seeking to establish the joy of the resurrection in our hearts. But how can joy be attained? We can't force it, but we can *cultivate* it through the discipline of celebration, along with other physical and spiritual efforts. Please read Psalm 16:5-11 and 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 as we continue to bask in the power of the resurrection.

Milepost #383: On the Spiritual Discipline of Celebration!

Jesus said, "I have come that you might have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). Jesus also said, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added unto you" (Matthew 6: 33-34). And then there is the Apostle Paul writing, "... for I have learned to be content with whatever I have. I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need. I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:11b-13).

In any case then, we want to count our blessings, and as the song says, "name them one by one, and it will surprised you what the Lord has done" (Count Your Many Blessings, Johnson Oatman, Jr., 1897). That's not to say that we don't face difficult times and discouragement in our lives. Bad things happen to good people and evil still runs rampant in our world. And yet, when we are mindful of God's redeeming love for us, for the gift of life and breath, and for the fact that God has given us a Christian community to be part of now, and the eternal gift of salvation, what can we say? As Jesus said, "If the people kept quiet, even the stones would cry out" (Luke 19:40). So then, let us worship the Lord, let us come before God's gates with thanksgiving and into His courts with praise. Let us celebrate God's goodness! Or in the words of one of my favorite hymns by Amos Herr, 1890:

I owe the Lord a morning song
 Of gratitude and praise,
 For the kind mercy He has shown
 In length'ning out my days.

 I see another day;

 Now may His Spirit, as the light,
 Direct me in His way.
- Keep me from danger and from sin; Help me Thy will to do, So that my heart be pure within, And I Thy goodness know.
- 4. Keep me till Thou wilt call me hence,

 And save me, Lord, for Jesus' sake—
 He shed His blood for me.
