This year the National Commission on Military, National and Public Service is currently determining the fate of Selective Service (Draft) Registration and they need to hear from people of conscience and faith. Currently there is no option to register as a conscientious objector. If the Commission fails to endorse ending Registration, they must ask Congress to allow people to register as conscientious objectors. As people of peace we should and can submit written comments through the Commission's website (inspire2serve.gov) or via email including the subject line "Docket 05-2018-01" to national.commission.on.service.info@mail.mil For further questions or information contact Mil Penner.

Milepost #549 - Reflections

Four months ago, I wrote "I was amazed recently at how quickly the barren frostiness of winter becomes transformed into the lush greenery of spring. It took only a few

weeks for stark empty trees around our house to become a lovely canopy of green."
And now, I am amazed that everything is still green, knowing full well that a month from now the green leaves will be gone and the barren frostiness of winter will once again be upon us.

I have been reflecting on what transpired over the summer months, specifically Thriving Thursdays and Fall Festival.

A total of 32 different adults helped out with Thriving Thursdays—27 from Shalom, 2 from Northview Church of the Brethren, 1 from FMC, and 2 former Shalomites—Rachel Maust/Urquizo Zarate and Phil Shenk. We averaged 15 kids at our 5 sessions—mostly from the neighborhood but some from the church too. The adult to child ratio was quite good and you could tell.

And then, on September 16, some 50 days after our last Thriving Thursday, we invited the kids back for Fall Festival and told them to bring their families and their neighbors. We exceeded our expected turnout of 60, with robust participation from both neighborhood and church.

Along with help from a number of you, including Marilynn Teel, CoraLyn Turentine, Carol Bixler, and Brian Bither, I got used to walking the streets around Shalom, inviting neighbors to participate. I hope to do it again for our Christmas Banquet.
