Small Groups at Shalom

In the past Shalom Mennonite Church encouraged everyone to be in a small group for fellowship and fun. This continues with our new structure. In our vision statement adopted in 2017 the Shalom congregation set a goal of having 85% of Shalom participants involved in small groups. Small groups are one of the most effective settings for personal growth and spiritual nourishment if groups are structured around sharing and caring. The Community Life Commission (CLC) encourages each of us to have a place to talk about how God is working in our lives and how that is affecting us. It is in the small group setting where we most often share our natural and spiritual gifts with each other, and we encourage each person to know and share these gifts with the groups and with the larger Shalom Church.

In the past small groups tended to remain fairly stable over the years. Some small groups actually became large groups of 15 to 20 participants. Periodically the pastor elder team or the church council recommended that groups reform to mix up and encourage new connections among the Shalom participants. As Shalom transitioned to our new structure we again affirmed that small groups are vital to the life of shalom. The CLC recommends that groups remain small from 5 to 12 members and evaluate their purpose every 3 to 6 months. As small groups become more fluid opportunities develop to include new participants.

A few things are encouraged to happen in all small group settings. The first is that at the beginning of each small group all participants are to tell their story, including their spiritual journeys. Your story is told so that everyone in the group gets to know you. Often our personal stories center around the events of our lives and we do not include how God is working in our lives and families. Groups to foster and teach each of us how to talk about God's love and how we experience this in our lives.

In other words, it is easy to tell everyone about the physical things we are doing such as trips we are taking and lawns we are tending, but we encourage you to share how God's love is working in your life as you take the trips and as you care for your lawns, for example after saying, I mowed the lawn, I could reflect on how God is pruning my life for growth. This encourages other members in the group to reflect on their own spiritual journeys. By getting more comfortable talking about how God is working in your life with friends from church you are more likely to share your story with all those you encounter even your family members. The groups are to encourage us to blossom where we are planted and to own God's Love for our life as we talk and share the interests we hold in common or the hobbies that we meet around.

So the invitation is out. Lets talk and find interests we can interact around and encourage each other to grow in love and express the passions that make life meaningful. Contact a pastor or myself, Herb Troyer, as we plan for new groups to start.
