Our daily Bible readings engaged the books of Joel and Isaiah as they depicted the Messiah as the one who brings vindication through judgment.

"Story of the Bible" Assigned Reading

Throughout our "Story of the Bible" sermon series, we will recommend daily readings at home. Next week's readings are:

Monday: Psalm 67, Daniel 7-9

Tuesday: Proverbs 11:7-8, Daniel 10-12, Ezekiel 38-39

Wednesday: Proverbs 12:24-27, Zechariah 1-4 Thursday: Proverbs 12:17-22, Zechariah 5-8 Friday: Proverbs 11:23, 14:19, Zechariah 9-13

Saturday: Zechariah 14, Proverbs 13:16-18, Malachi 1-4

About the readings: With the exception of the Psalms and Proverbs that we haven't read yet, this week's reading assignments bring our study of the Older Testament to a conclusion. I'm not going to be preaching about these texts until two Sundays from now (12/20), so if you want to wait until next week to read them, you can. Starting next week, we are going to have a four-week break from daily Scripture reading assignments so that we can focus on the seasons of Advent and Christmas and

give ourselves a chance to catch up on portions we may have missed. However, just in case there are people who have not missed any of the daily reading assignments and would like to have some guidance during this break, I am going to offer a plan for reading through the "apocryphal" books of 1-4 Maccabees and Ecclesiasticus. Although these books are not authoritative to Christians in the same way that the rest of our Scriptures are, they offer great insight into the historical period that occurred between the Older and New Testaments, and many Christians through the centuries have found them to be inspiring supplements to our Holy Scriptures. OUTREACH: Relationships beyond Shalom

The following material is provided for your information in preparation for our congregational meeting on Sunday, December 6th. In addition to adopting a Shalom budget for 2021, we will be making a decision about distributing excess funds we have available from this year. (See the attached proposal, and information about the organizations being considered for extra funding.)

All of this material has been in the newsletter the past two weeks, but two changes have been made to the proposal this week: 1) we have learned that Natasha Diener will no longer be continuing to teach in Bolivia after the end of this school year, so she is no longer seeking support. So that \$1,000 has been removed from the proposal, and 2) enough materials have been given for hurricane/flood relief in Honduras to fill six barrels instead of four (thanks to all who contributed!), so we are recommending to increase that support from \$800 to \$1,200.00 (\$200/barrel). That reduces the total for the proposal from \$22,500 to \$21,900.00.

Reflections on the Journey

Imagining Advent

In recent months, our nanny has started making big calendars on posters for our kids, so that they can count down the days to our next major event. This has been a powerful reminder for me of how much calendars shape us. Their whole lives are influenced by these calendars. Last month, the calendar counted down to November 16, the day when we planned to rent an RV and drive it down to South Carolina to celebrate my grandmother's 100th birthday. As soon as that calendar went up, it became the focus of nearly everything we did. My daughters got excited about making cards for Great-Grandma for her big birthday. At dinner, we got lots of questions about what South Carolina was like. For play time, we often built pretend RVs to simulate the experience. For me, this reinforced how important Advent is. When we make Christ's coming the focus of our lives, it shapes the way we think, work, and play.

It also occurred to me that my kids were only influenced by the calendar to the extent that they were interested in it. Riding in an "RV" didn't mean anything to them until their mom showed them pictures of an RV and encouraged them to imagine what it would be like to travel in one. When we talked about who we would see and what we would do in South Carolina, it brought the concept to life. Likewise, in order to be shaped by the season of Advent, it's not enough to put a calendar up: we should really think about what it is we are waiting for God to do.

In what ways do you long for Christ's coming? Do you know people who are lonely and suffering who need Christ's intervention? Are there problems with our society that trouble your soul? Is there a struggle in your life from which you learn for liberation? Do you find yourself worrying about the prospect of death? I encourage you to bring these concerns to the forefront of your mind and imagine

what it would mean for Christ to come and bring healing to them. Then, let those hopes be the focus of your yearnings and your prayers during Advent. Then we - like little children - may find ourselves genuinely excited when Christ does show up in our lives and our world.
