# Milepost #299: NThe Twelve Spiritual Disciplines

As Frank mentioned in his sermon last Sunday, our church is going to be focusing on spiritual disciplines this year, which are practices that Christians have developed over the centuries to help us cultivate and sustain our relationship with God. There is no official list of "the spiritual disciplines," but one influential writer named Richard Foster wrote a book about them years ago called, Celebration of Discipline, in which he groups a number of important spiritual practices into twelve categories. The Discipleship Commission has decided to use his list as a basis for our approach to spiritual disciplines this year, though not in the same order in which Foster presents them. We encourage anyone who wants to study this subject in greater depth to read this book, which will be made available in the near future after we order more copies.

Rather than studying all of the disciplines at the same time, we are going to focus on one per month. Here is the schedule of our emphases for the entire year:

January – Simplicity
February – Confession
March – Fasting
April – Celebration
May – Study
June – Service
July – Prayer
August – Meditation
September – Worship
October – Submission
November – Solitude
December – Guidance

For those of you who have already been practicing one or more of these disciplines for years, as well as those of you who are new to them but who have had eye-opening experiences, we invite you to share your insights and experiences with the congregation. You can do this by sharing a testimony in a worship service, writing a milepost, teaching a Sunday school class to youth or adults, or through another creative venue that may come to mind. Please contact one of the members of the Discipling Commission if you'd like to do this: Martha Yoder Maust, Jay Brubaker, Lynelle Leinbach, or Brian Bither, and they will work with you to find a way for you to share about your insights and experiences.

May God bless as all in 2018 as we seek to know God better with the help of these ancient Christian practices.
