The **Anabaptist Disabilities Network (ADN)** recently published a Disability Language Guide to assist us in communicating the value of each individual when we speak about people who have disabilities. Please read the one-page Guide that is attached to this issue of Journeying Together. Here are some of the basic guidelines:

- In general, we prefer person-first language. Person-first language stresses the importance of putting the individual first. For example, "a person who has a disability" instead of "a disabled person."
- There are some exceptions to "person-first" language. In general, Deaf, blind, or autistic people and communities prefer "identity-first" language. For example, "an autistic person" instead of "a person with autism."
- When in doubt, individuals should be asked how they want to be described. Don't assume!
- Everyone prefers to be called by their name when possible.

Next week, July 6-11, the Mennonite Church USA's general assembly nicknamed MennoCon21 will take place in Cincinnati, Ohio. This is likely to be the closest it will ever be to Indianapolis (2 hours) so you might consider driving down for a day's events. You can also watch it virtually. Fees are involved. There will be Bible Study each morning and a worship service each evening. Go to the website of the Mennonite Church USA for details. This year the delegate assembly will not deal with complicated or controversial issues. Delegates will vote on nominees for the various open positions, listen to reports from church agencies and vote on by-law changes. Most of the bylaw changes clear up confusing language or bring the by-laws up to date. For example, the references to the periodical "The Mennonite" are removed because it no longer exists. The assembly will also vote on a by-law change that would permit virtual voting, something we have never done before. Wilma Bailey, delegate
