<u>Solar Panel Project – Congregational Vote</u> Process

The Vision and Accountability Team (VAT) would like to take a vote on the Solar Panel Proposal from the Outreach Commission this coming Sunday, August 4th. We will be voting on the following statement: "I am in favor of going ahead with the Solar Panel Proposal as presented on Sunday, July 21 with a contract involving Jefferson Electric, Inc. for \$79,942.50 - This amount will be paid by transferring \$40,000 from Shalom's Checking account (operating budget surplus) with the remaining balance to be paid by individual contributions."

The ballot will require your name but each vote will be kept confidential. Ballots will be distributed with the bulletin and collected at the back of the sanctuary by Carl Rhine (the vote counter). Those not present on Sunday will be given an opportunity to send their vote to Carl by Sunday, August 11th to the email address: crhine@iu.edu

Anonymous comments can be made on the voting ballot and will be provided to the Outreach Commission (comments will be separated from the vote portion of the ballot).

Reflections On Pilgrimage

Our heritage

How do you define what makes up your heritage? On our recent Anabaptist heritage tour, I gained a new insight into that question.

The story involved the coming together of several stories that span centuries.

In Rottenburg, Germany, we visited the site where Micheal Sattler was burned at the stake while his wife Margaret was drowned for their Anabaptist faith. We learned how Michael had continued to pray for his tormentors even with part of his tongue cut out. And he refused the gun powder that people were offered to hasten their death when burned at the stake.

In Schartzenau, Germany, we stood by the river where Alexander Mack baptized the first members of the Church of the Brethren. Having grown up in the Church of the Brethren, I had often heard of this place and it was moving to actually stand at the riverside and picture my ancestors entering the river for baptism.

In Brammental, we attended a Mennonite Church service. The pastor Wolfgang Kraus has been active in the German Mennonite Peace Committee. He shared the story that ties all of this together.

Five years ago, Boko Haram stormed a school founded by the Church of the Brethren in the 1940s, awakened students and abducted 275 school girls. The Church of the Brethren in Nigeria is known as Ekklesiyar Yon'uwa in Nigeria (EYN) which is Hausa for Church of

Children of the Same Mother in Nigeria. As international attention focused on the call to "Bring back our girls," the EYN continued its Christian and Muslim peace initiative.

The German Mennonite Peace Committee knew of this work and, in 2016, they awarded the Michael Sattler Peace Prize to the Christian and Muslim Peace Initiative. Ephrahim Kadala, the EYN peace coordinator, and Hussaini Shauibu, a mediator and college teacher, traveled to Germany to receive the award. After receiving the award, Ephrahim asked if he might visit Schwarzenau. He stood beside the Elb River, as I had done the day before. Then, he pulled off his shoes and rolled up his pants and jumped into the river. Smiling, he looked up and said, "Now I have come home."
