RAICES:

The Refugee and Immigration Center for Education and Legal Services (RAICES) is the only nonprofit organization in the country that works directly with and provides legal services to children, adults and families detained in federal custody. In 2017, it closed 51,000 cases with free legal representation.

In response to the separation of more than 2000 immigrant children from their parents at the US border, hundreds of people created social media fundraisers for RAICES. One viral fundraiser donated more than \$20 million. Although the millions of dollar sounds like a lot of money, they said the reality is that it gets eaten up fast when dealing with things like attorney fees, paying bond and transportation costs.

The interesting fact to note is that RAICES began as a grassroots organization and has a long term relationship with Mennonite Voluntary Service and San Antonio Mennonite Church.In 1990, the organization initially offered services like clothing, medical care and shelter to immigrants fleeing civil wars in Central America.

The most interesting note is that RAICES donated the bond money needed for Gemina's release from the Eloy Detention Center!

Peace Sunday:

The Mennonite World Conference is invitingcongregations to observe Peace Sunday together with brothers and sisters in the global Anabaptist church family on September 23, 2018.

The theme for this year's Peace Sunday is: "A Renewed Peace Church Welcomes the Stranger." Throughout the biblical narrative we encounter a God who reminds his people to show hospitality to others, especially those who are the most vulnerable in society – the widow, the orphan, and the alien.

Milepost #514 - A Bench for Caps

Last Sunday Jeanne Smucker based her sermon on II Kings 4:1-7, the story about the widow who was destitute, having nothing left in her house "except a little oil". Elisha the Prophet advised her to "Go around and ask all your neighbors for empty jars...don't ask for just a few. Then go inside, shut the door behind you...Pour oil into all the jars, and as each is filled, put it to one side...They brought the jars to her and she kept pouring. When all the jars were full, she said, 'Bring me another one.' But her son replied, "There is not a jar left." Then the oil stopped flowing.

A woman named Marilynn said, "If we can collect 400 pounds of plastic bottle caps we can get a 100% recycled bench for the playground." Someone said to Marilynn, "Do you have any idea how many bottle caps it takes to make 400 pounds?" Marilynn said, "Yes I do. I have done it before, and WE can do it again!" And Marilynn went on to enlist the

support of the Congregation, the Neighborhood, Northview Church of the Brethren, and the Children of the Church. And just when the going got tough, we got Good News from Green Tree Plastics in Evansville: "You only need to collect 200 pounds of plastic caps to get your 100% recycled bench." "Yeah" shouts Marilynn, "WE are going to make it!"

Visit your neighbors and your coworkers and bring lots of plastic caps this Sunday, September 2nd. Marilynn Teel and Mike Wigginton are planning to take our allotment of plastic caps to Green Tree Plastics on September 7th and bring home the bench for the playground.

When there were no empty jars left, the oil stopped flowing. Lord, give us oil for our lamp.
