REFLECTIONS ON THE JOURNEY

MennoCon21: Bring the Peace

For those of you who are new or newish to the Mennonite world, the Mennonite Church USA hosts a denomination-wide gathering called "Mennonite Convention" biannually in which it hosts a series of worship services every morning and evening, offers youth activities and educational seminars for adults, creates an opportunity for Mennonite individuals and agencies to connect and network, and holds a delegate session in which representatives from each church and agency can participate in denominational decision-making. This year, "#MennoCon21" is being hosted in Cincinnati as a hybrid service, which – like our services here at Shalom – include both in-person and online participants. This year's theme is "Bring the Peace," and from my perspective, it has already been very good. (And it's just started!)

For the morning worship services, there is a recurring preacher/teacher – Dr. Safwat Marzouk – who has been teaching at Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary but recently accepted a post at another theological institution. Dr. Marzouk acknowledged that we are coming out of a time of a double-pandemic – the COVID-19 pandemic and a racism pandemic – and he encouraged us to approach peacemaking through the covenantal model of the Bible. As you may recall from the Story of the Bible series, the covenant between God and the People of God is at the very center of the Story. It is essential for us to keep both of these parts in view as we seek peace. On the one hand, we have to acknowledge that peace is beyond our capacity as individual human beings to create or control, and so we turn to God to do Her part in bringing peace. Praying to God, waiting for God, and lamenting what seems to be the absence of God are all Biblical ways for us to beckon God to intervene.

On the other hand, we should not use our belief that "God is in control" as an excuse for inaction. On the contrary, God has committed to intervening in the world *through us*. On our end, we must be sure that we are being receptive to peace, following Christ as he leads us to peace, and repenting when we ourselves fall short of peace. Through this dynamic process of turning to God and then being empowered by God, we can be agents of peace in the world. Pastors Lesley and Caleb McClendon summarized this process in their sermon on opening night in a memorable phrase: Receive peace. Extend peace. Protect your peace. For times like this, such advice is important!

As someone who was not born into the Mennonite tradition, I have always found it to be deeply comforting to connect with other believers in the Mennonite Church who share my values and are working for the kingdom of God all of the world in ways I didn't even know about. I still find that reassuring, even through this virtual connection, and I hope the knowledge of it brings you some comfort too. ~ Brian
