Last Sunday, May 5

We began a new sermon series on the book of Micah, which will continue throughout the months of May and June. Brian preached the first sermon in the series on Micah 1:1-12 by introducing us to the genre of Biblical prophecy and encouraging us to make space for prophets to speak in our institutions and in our hearts.

This Sunday, May 12

We will jump ahead to Micah 7:1-10, where we hear the prophet speak in his own voice and reflect on the deep corruption that Israel was experiencing at the time. We'll reflect on the interrelationship between corruption, distrust, and violence, and look to Micah as an example as one who trusts in God for vindication, even when the system is broken.

Next Sunday, May 19

We will study Micah 2:1-11, where we will encounter some of Micah's most substantive criticisms of the powerful and privileged. Micah's comments about the abuse of power and exploitation are very relevant to us today. They force us to consider whether we are using religion as a means of reassuring us that we are ok or challenging us to live according to the way of God.

Then I got a call from Dagne. He was going to take a five month sabbatical, and he and the elders wondered if I would fill in for him while he was gone? Of course, I jumped at the opportunity. I would be expected to preach twice a month and he would line up the other preachers for the time he would be gone. Thank you Dagne!

Yesterday, ten years later, Brad Sommer, VAT Chair, met with the Pastoral Team to discuss details of how we will cover pastoral duties while Brian is gone on sabbatical and paternity leave July through November--another

opportunity for an old man, now age 70. Brian is working hard to make sure there is a preacher in the pulpit for each Sunday he is gone. And yet preaching is only one part of what Brian does.
