## Dismantling Racism Process

At the close of our Dismantling Racism class in the spring, the curriculum recommended doing an audit of our congregational structures and procedures to see what changes needed to be made. Outreach Commission, which initiated the Anti-Racism statement of our congregation the year before, has recommended we use Widerstand Consulting (the same organization that created our curriculum) to do the audit. The process would last 2 months and cost \$5000. This recommendation was approved by the VAT. Commission Chairs recommended that the question come to the congregation for discussion.

Brian is planning to preach the next 3 Sundays on how to have fruitful conversation, how to talk about race, and how to think about systemic and structural issues. On Sunday, August 22, we will have a 12:00 business meeting in which we will divide into small groups for conversation about this proposal. On August 29 we will again convene at noon to talk about any remaining issues and to make a decision about whether to proceed with an audit by Widerstand Consulting. Discipling Commission is leading this process.

## Safely Gathering

Safely Gathering Committee met by Zoom on 7/28/21 and reviewed data on rapidly increasing Covid cases. Over the past month cases in central Indiana have increased from 2 per 100,000 population per day to 12, or a six-fold increase. The new Delta variant (which currently represents 91% of cases in central Indiana) is far more contagious and can cause more severe illness than previous variants. CDC now recommends indoor masking even for vaccinated people in areas with rapid spread.

Because all of the children under 12 in our congregation (and a few of the adults) in our congregation are unvaccinated, we have decided not to proceed with indoor Sunday school in September as we had hoped to do. We will continue to monitor the data, and if numbers go down during the fall we will make changes as appropriate. If, on the other hand, cases rise to 15 cases/100,000/day, we will recommend resuming Zoom-only worship services.

At the sack lunch event on Sunday August 1, be sure to distance yourself from people not in your household. If you have trouble hearing from a distance of 6+ feet, please put your mask on before getting closer to others.

## REFLECTIONS ON THE JOURNEY

## Adapting to the Seasons

"For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven... a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted... a time to break down and a time to build up... a time to keep and a time to throw away..." – Ecclesiastes 3:1-6

As we approach the end of July, we are entering a "seasonal change" in American society. Children are returning to school, the travel and tourism industries are winding down, and community-based activities are starting back up. The church feels this change just as much as everyone else. Sunday morning attendance typically drops during the summer and picks up again in the fall, so we generally elect new leaders, create new ministries, and plan community gatherings in September and October – when the majority of us are here.

Ecclesiastes encourages us to pay attention to these shifts in the seasons and to be intentional about adapting to them. In fact, it offers us specific points to consider when we enter a new season, some of which I have highlighted above. For example, it tells us that there is "a time to keep and a time to throw away," which encourages us to consider which possessions, ambitions, and commitments are taking up unnecessary space in our lives and to get rid of them. It also tells us that there is "a time to break down and a time to build up" which invites us to do some evaluation: Which practices and structures in our lives are working for us, and which ones need to be replaced by something new? It's easy for us to keep doing things the way we have always been doing them, even when it no longer makes sense, but there comes a time when we should "pluck what has been planted" – acknowledge the benefits that our practices brought us in the past and then bring them to a close – so that we can "plant" new ones. This regular re-evaluation of what we need is necessary for cultivating a healthy spiritual life.

It's easy – especially during a pandemic – to slide from one season into another without really thinking about it. But when we do that, life tends to get cluttered, unfocused, and draining. So let us take some time – both as individuals and collectively – to consider what God wants us to do with our time and resources during *this* season of our lives. ~ Brian
