I invite us to embrace these paradoxical qualities as we come together Sunday to discuss the proposed mission statement:

Shalom Mennonite Church is a diverse community rooted in the Anabaptist Christian tradition. Together we follow Jesus as we worship God, grow in the Spirit, support one another, and share God's justice, peace and love with those around us and the world.

We are hearing affirmation for the statement. We don't want to prolong the process, yet our goal is widespread congregational ownership.
