For Christians in a modern era, these stories are confusing if not troubling. Can a person really choose what to believe and what not to believe, or does the mind do that on its own? If we can choose what to believe, shouldn't we always choose to believe whatever positions have the most evidence behind them? How can Jesus command us to believe him? Let us pray that God will give us a deeper understanding of the contours of truth, doubt, and faith.

Landlord/Tenant Legislation

On this Monday morning past, several Shalom members participated in a press conference on the third floor of the State House encouraging legislatures to remove harmful language in Senate Bill 148. We were encouraged to do so by Family Promise (formerly Interfaith Hospitality Network), one of many organizations advocating on behalf of tenant/landlord issues and serving populations directly affected by changes in tenant/landlord laws. An Amendment was tacked on to SB148 which includes dangerous language for tenants. The attached letter explains why the Senate needs to remove harmful language that was amended into the bill without a public hearing.

An update to this note indicated that the bill was passed and your perspective on the legislation can be directed to the Governor to recommend he not sign the bill.
