Our relationship with God

Last Sunday, December 2:

Thad Wilson introduced our series on guidance during the season of Advent. Looking to the Magi as our ongoing example, he reminded us that we need to be ready to pack our bags and go if and when our guiding light from God appears. And even if no clear "light" does appear in our lives, there are ways that we can seek God's voice by listening to the still, small voice within each of us.

This Sunday, December 9:

Pastor Brian will preach from Luke 3:1-20 on the theme of preparing for the unexpected. Two thousand years ago, John the Baptist went around preaching the message, "Prepare the way of the Lord." He taught the people that a Messiah was coming who was unlike anything the people of Israel had ever seen before. But if they had no idea what this Messiah would be like, how could they know how to prepare for him? In this sermon, Brian wrestles with the mysterious claim that prayer and repentance can somehow "prepare the way" for religious, social, and even political change.

Next Sunday, December 16:

Pastor Frank will draw from Luke 1:39-45 to preach on the joy that can emerge in seeking God's guidance in community and anticipating what God might do next.

Milepost #611 Looking Back, Looking Forward

For Advent this year, we are traveling with the Magi on a journey of guidance. We are looking to Heaven to ask the question, "As we wait for Christ to redeem the world, what it is that God wants us to do?" If you read the actual story of the Magi in Matthew 2 carefully, then you will notice that the guiding light disappeared for a while – which is why the Magi went to Herod's court to ask for advice. That inspired the chief priests and the scribes to look back in the Scriptures to see if there was any word that addressed their question – and sure enough, they found an answer in an ancient prophecy that Micah had given to the people of Judea.

As Thad mentioned in his sermon on Sunday, discernment can be tricky, and there is not always a clear "guiding light" to tell us what to do. Even when we do feel like God has given us a strong calling or inspiration,

that sense of clarity may flicker or disappear for a time, when we question whether we are doing the right thing. That can be quite unnerving!

In such situations, it is sometimes helpful to look back: to consider what God has said or done in the past, whether we look back to our own most formative religious experiences or to the stories of others who have gone before us. In recalling these experiences, we may recall and rediscover something that helps us see a way forward. After all, that is why we re-read the ancient prophecies every year. Even though they testify to events that have already occurred, they remind us of God's faithfulness and God's promises, and they take on new and fresh meaning when applied to our own day.

May God bless us all as we seek to discern the will of God during this holy season..
