Last Sunday, Sept 1

Pastor Sabrina Falls will preach. The sermon text is John 4:1-30; 39-42. This is the story about the Samaritan woman who comes to Jacob's well to draw water and meets Jesus there. As a Jew, Jesus' interaction with a Samaritan is highly unusual. The sermon will reflect on why this woman's encounter with Christ is so meaningful for the gospel message and on what "living water" provides in times of personal and societal spiritual drought.

Gun Violence Action

Gun violence continues to be a major public health problem in the United States. The Outreach Commission sees this as a social justice issue. An average of over 600 people die each week in the US form gun violence. One thing we can do to reduce gun violence is to require background checks for all gun sales. The US House of Representatives passed a bill in February to require universal background checks. Senate Bill 42, introduced in January, has the same requirement. But Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell has refused to call this bill up for a vote. If you support universal background checks for all gun sales, call or email Indiana's two US Senators Mike Braun (202-224-4814) and Todd Young (202 224-5623), asking them to support SB 42. and encourage them to urge Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell to bring the bill up for a vote.

Immigration Solidarity Hotline

Immigration raises another set of social justice issues. Faith in Indiana (formerly IndyCan) has created a Rapid Response network to help persons who are threatened by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). This includes a

Solidarity Hotline that persons can call to get immediate response from people who will come and support them in relating to ICE or other government officials. Jeanne Smucker and Brad Yoder are part of this network. If you are able and willing to join this network, contact Jeanne or Brad.
